

#### In the Liturgy of the Church Helen Ackermann

With this Sunday we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost which concludes the Easter Season. We hear from the Gospel of John. The evangelist John has all major events occurring at the same time, whereas Luke describes fifty days that occur before the final coming of the Holy Spirit. It is best to remember that within the second creation story, God breathes divine life into the human formed of clay. With our Baptism we celebrate our oneness with God by the power of the Holy Spirit. This is what we are celebrating today. It is fitting that we celebrate Confirmation on this day with the young people of St. Mark Parish. Being confirmed does not mean that this is when the Holy Spirit enters the lives of the young people, but rather it is a time when this reality is confirmed. Young people are already a part of the divineness of God,

Luke, the writer of the Acts of the Apostles, vividly describes the coming of the Holy Spirit through the symbols of fire and wind. Those who are gathered find that they can spread the good news of Jesus in various languages. Using the gifts we have, we too can rely on the Holy Spirit to enable us to go forth preaching the good news of Jesus Christ.

Since the Holy Spirit of God is already a part of who we are, we need to ask for guidance in seeking out the truth of who God is. The God who Jesus reveals is a God of mercy and love. This is the love that we are to share as disciples of Jesus Christ. We ask blessings on the young people of our parish, that they might move with confidence as they share this divine love with others,

## St. Bede the Venerable, priest, doctor of the Church (672 -735)

When he was only eight years old, Bede went to live with the Benedictine monks in an abbey in Jarrow, England. In his own words, he said, "I ever took delight in learning, teaching and writing." He wrote on all topics; music, math, medicine and science. He educated over 600 monks in these subjects. He also wrote scripture commentaries. He is considered the first English historian. He was a simple man and spent time in prayer and song. In his old age he completed a translation of the Gospel of John. He said he did not fear death because "for we have a loving Lord."

#### FROM THE DIOCESE

## Corpus Christi June 2, 2024 "Walking with Jesus in the Corpus Christi Procession"

The annual solemnity of the most holy body and blood of Christ (also called Corpus Christi, "Body of Christ") finds many parishes around the world celebrating a procession in which a host consecrated at Mass is then carried in a monstrance in a solemn way through a city's streets—June 2 in 2024. Like the Blessed Sacrament itself, there is more to the Corpus Christi procession than meets the eye. It is an occasion to profess our faith in the sacrament of the Eucharist, to thank Jesus for the gift of His cross and presence in this sacrament—and to walk with Him toward the promised land of heaven. This is the eighth in a series on key themes for the eucharistic revival written by Chris Carstens, Ann Lankford, and Christopher Ruff. A Minute with Jesus: The Holy Spirit and the Eucharist Even after the Apostles had experienced the Risen Christ, they were afraid. They gathered with Mary on the day of Pentecost and prayed behind locked doors, waiting as instructed for the Gift of the Holy Spirit. After the Holy Spirit descended upon them on Pentecost, the Apostles were no longer afraid and were equipped to fulfill their mission. It is the same for us today. When we receive the Eucharist, we also receive God the Holy Spirit, to abide in the depths of our hearts. If we allow Him, the Spirit of Truth will transform us and we will no longer be afraid, but be equipped with peace and strength for our mission.

Let us then prepare for each Eucharistic encounter in the same way the Apostles prepared for Pentecost, "in prayer ... with Mary ..." (Acts 1:14).

#### How does God speak to me?

Have you ever wondered how God may be speaking to you? Perhaps you are waiting to hear a loud, booming voice come from the heavens to tell you what to do or which way to go. While this isn't completely out of the question, often God takes a much subtler approach. In 1 Kings, we have the account of the Prophet Elijah standing at the entrance of a cave, waiting for the Lord to appear. As he waits, he encounters a strong, violent wind, a powerful earthquake, and a consuming fire, yet God was not revealing Himself in any of those powerful examples. Finally, as Elijah waited, he heard a soft, quiet whisper. At that, he knelt to the ground and prayed. God often speaks to us, not in grand and impressive ways, but in the silence. When we can still our hearts, that's when we begin to hear His voice, calling us into relationship and to follow Him. Sometimes that invitation is to follow the Lord as one who lovingly serves others in the priesthood. #### **DEUTERONOMY 4:32-34, 39-40**

Moses said to the people: "Ask now of the days of old, before your time, ever since God created man upon the earth; ask from one end of the sky to the other: Did anything so great ever happen before? Was it ever heard of? Did a people ever hear the voice of God speaking from the midst of fire, as you did, and live? Or did any god venture to go and take a nation for himself from the midst of another nation, by testings, by signs and wonders, by war, with strong hand and outstretched arm, and by great terrors, all of which the LORD, your God, did for you in Egypt before your very eyes? This is why you must now know, and fix in your heart, that the LORD is God in the heavens above and on earth below, and that there is no other. You must keep his statutes and commandments that I enjoin on you today, that you and your children after you may prosper, and that you may have long life on the land which the LORD, your God, is giving you forever."

The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs, heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if only we suffer with him so that we may also be glorified with him.

#### **MATTHEW 28:16-20**

The eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had ordered them. When they all saw him, they worshiped, but they doubted. Then Jesus approached and said to them, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

#### **Reflection Questions:**

- 1. What does your Baptism mean to you? Does your Baptism empower you?
- 2. How do you understand the meaning of the Holy Trinity?
- 3. With these three ways of being God, which appeals to you the most?
- 4. To whom do you pray when you take time to have a conversation with God?

Concluding Prayer: Lord God, you surround me with your great love. Help me to understand your love because of the Mystery of the Holy Spirit. Enable me to share with others your great love for me. I make this prayer in unity with the Jesus, he who is Lord forever. Amen.
