

### SACRED WORSHIP

## All Saints—November 1

Liturgies: 8:10 am Noon and 6:30 pm

The first documented observation of a Saints Day is in the fourth century held in memory



the martyrs. During the persecution of Emperor Diocletian, the number of martyrs became great. Around 397, the first Sunday after Pentecost was designated as the common day.

About 300 years later, Pope Gregory III consecrated a chapel in the Basilica of St. Peter to all saints including the martyrs on November 1. A hundred years later, in the early 800s, Pope Gregory IV set the celebration of All Saints on November 1 for the universal Church.

We honor the saints because our memory of them can help us live holy lives. We do not face persecution, but faithfulness remains a problem. We do not face physical death at the end of a sword, but we do face the possibility of a spiritual death at the hands of contemporary values that are at odds with the way revealed by Jesus.

Jesus, the Son of God offered us rebirth into the family of God, a high status that we cannot earn. This is offered to us to accept or refuse. The saints and martyrs accepted this invitation.

We honor all those who have accepted Jesus' offer despite difficulties. In honoring them, we can examine our own choice to accept or refuse Jesus' offer to live with God and examine our level of commitment.

"We are called to live like no one else so that one day we can live like no one else." This is difficult, but if we include others in choice and struggle to remain faithful, will there not be success with God? Consider inviting the communion of saints to the struggle. They remained faithful. Not one of them was perfect, but they persevered. Then again, we can separate ourselves from them as well.

## **November—Remembering All Souls**

During November it is customary in Catholic tradition to remember ourselves to those who have died.



Through November easels are set in the church to write the names of family members, friends, acquaintances and admired persons who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith which the parish will hold in the general intercessions on week days and Sundays in November.

## In the Liturgy of the Church —Helen Ackermann

Jesus is being challenged again in this week's Gospel from the community of Matthew. He is being asked what he thinks are the greatest commandments. He relies on his Jewish background and quotes from the Scriptures. He indicates that the first commandment is the greatest, asking for complete love of God with heart, mind and soul. He then adds a second commandment which is to love your neighbor as yourself. He provides a balance in terms of the commandments.

What has always intrigued me when hearing this Gospel proclaimed are the closing words of the second commandment. We are to love our neighbors as ourselves. We know that that means caring for the common good but what enables us to do so? How do we come to love ourselves? It seems loving ourselves begins with the human love we experience. This human love is expressed through the positive experiences we have. It might not always come from family, but it might come from a teacher who cares about us. It might come from a friend who stands by our side. What is necessary is for us to have a positive view of ourselves.

Our worship together can lead us to a positive view of ourselves as we hear of God's great love through the Scriptures. We learn that God through his son, Jesus Christ, focuses on our goodness not on our sinfulness. When we know of God's great love, we find it much easier to love God and to love our neighbor.

We remember this week, All Saints Day, (Holy Day of Obligation) Wednesday, The Commemoration of All the Faithful (All Souls Day) Martin de Porres, religious (Friday) Charles Borromeo, bishop (Saturday)

#### St. Charles Borromeo, bishop (1538-1584)

Charles Borromeo was born into a life of wealth. When he was only 12, his uncle who would later become a pope gave him the title to valuable church properties. At the age of 22 he became Cardinal. He enjoyed his position and lived a life that was part of the power in the church. He was a good student and later became involved in the Council of Trent which tried to correct the ideas of Protestants. When he was 25 he experienced a great change in his heart, a matter of conversion. He began to live in strict poverty. He became the bishop of Milan. Charles became a kind and wise bishop. He began the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine which became known in many parishes as CCD. Soon he trained enough catechists to teach 40,000 students. After a famine in Milan, he used his own money to care for the poor. When the city was hit by the plague, he nursed many back to health. He died at the age of 46. He is the patron saint of catechists and catechumens.



## **SCRIPTURE TEXTS - Ordinal 31**

Opening Prayer: Lord God, as I mediate on your holy word, teach me how to find the truth. So often it is easy for me to make myself important without really living in the way of your son, Jesus Christ. Forgive me. I make this prayer in the name of Jesus, he who is lord forever and ever. Amen.

#### Malachi 1:14b-2:2b, 8-10

A great King am I, says the LORD of hosts, and my name will be feared among the nations. And now, O priests, this commandment is for you: If you do not listen, if you do not lay it to heart, to give glory to my name, says the LORD of hosts, I will send a curse upon you and of your blessing I will make a curse. You have turned aside from the way, and have caused many to falter by your instruction; you have made void the covenant of Levi, says the LORD of hosts.

I, therefore, have made you contemptible and base before all the people, since you do not keep my ways, but show partiality in your decisions. Have we not all the one father? Has not the one God created us? Why then do we break faith with one another, violating the covenant of our fathers?

#### Psalm 131:1, 2, 3

R. In you, Lord, I have found my peace.

O LORD, my heart is not proud, nor are my eyes haughty; I busy not myself with great things, nor with things too sublime for me.

### 1 Thessalonians 2:7b-9, 13

Brothers and sisters: We were gentle among you, as a nursing mother cares for her children. With such affection for you, we were determined to share with you not only the gospel of God, but our very selves as well, so dearly beloved had you become to us. You recall, brothers and sisters, our toil and drudgery. Working night and day in order not to burden any of you, we proclaimed to you the gospel of God.

And for this reason we too give thanks to God unceasingly, that, in receiving the word of God from hearing us, you received not a human word but, as it truly is, the word of God, which is now at work in you who believe.

#### Matthew 23:1-12

Jesus spoke to the crowds and to his disciples, saying, "The scribes and the Pharisees have taken their seat on the chair of Moses. Therefore, do and observe all things whatsoever they tell you, but do not follow their example. For they preach but they do not practice. They tie up heavy burdens hard to carry and lay them on people's shoulders, but they will not lift a finger to move them. All their works are performed to be seen. They widen their phylacteries and lengthen their tassels. They love places of honor at banquets, seats of honor in synagogues, greetings in marketplaces, and the salutation 'Rabbi.' As for you, do not be called 'Rabbi.' You have but one teacher, and you are all brothers.

Call no one on earth your father; you have but one Father in heaven. Do not be called 'Master'; you have but one master, the Christ. The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted."

#### **Reflection Questions:**

- 1. Are you able to practice what you preach? Do your actions reflect your belief in Jesus Christ?
- 2. Knowing the laws of God, of our Church, might not lead us to a life of humility. What does humility mean to you?
- 3. Do you know of leaders who lead with humility and love?

Concluding Prayer: Lord God, give me the courage to live a life of humility. May my actions reflect the love of Jesus Christ, he who is Lord forever and ever. Amen.
